PROPOSAL TO ESTABLISH OR CHANGE THE MINIMUM GRADE REQUIREMENT OF AN UNDERGRADUATE MAJOR

Date: March 15, 2024

School/College: Franklin College of Arts and Sciences

Department/Division: Criminal Justice Studies Program

Program (Major and Degree): Minor in Criminal Justice

Proposed Effective Date: Fall 2024

1. Justification

What is the academic justification for instituting the requirement?

The Criminal Justice Studies Program faculty believes that only with a grade of "C" (2.0) or higher in all courses counting toward the minor can students demonstrate that they have acquired basic knowledge in the areas of criminal justice administration, criminology, related law and legal processes, and criminal justice systems.

2. Requirements

What specific entrance requirements are proposed?

All courses used to satisfy the minor requirements must be completed with a grade of "C" (2.0) or higher.

3. Results

How will the proposed requirement solve the academic problems outlined in the justification?

The proposed requirement, similar to the requirement for the major in Criminal Justice (A.B.), will ensure that the minor in Criminal Justice is awarded to students who demonstrate minimum competence in criminal justice related content. This will bring the minor in Criminal Justice in line with the major, which already has this requirement.

4. Consequences of the Requirement

a. How will this requirement affect the major involved?

Since the minor was approved in 2017, growth has been strong, with over 250 students in the minor currently, along with continued growth of the major, making it difficult to ensure there are enough seats in required courses. This grade requirement will help control this growth so that the minor is more sustainable.

- **b.** What effects are anticipated on other majors within the University? None.
- c. Are there any other anticipated effects on enrollment patterns within the University?

Minor - Criminal Justice Studies

- The minor will consist of 15 hours of upper-division coursework.
- At least 12 of the 15 hours are to be taken in residence.
- To preserve the interdisciplinary nature of the program of study, no more than nine hours of coursework may be drawn from the same discipline (as indicated by departmental prefix).
- All courses used to satisfy the minor requirements must be completed with a grade of "C"
 (2.0) or higher
