



University of Georgia Petition for Classification as In-State for Tuition Purposes

Who should file this petition?

U.S. citizens or U.S. Permanent Residents who have been classified as out-of-state for tuition purposes at UGA and who believe further information could alter that decision may file this petition. Petitions will not be considered for prior terms. See Section Seven for details on when and where to file this petition. *Note: Persons who have applied for, but not yet attained, U.S. Permanent Resident status may qualify for a waiver of the out-of-state tuition differential—contact the Office of the Registrar for further information.*

Qualifying Categories for Consideration as In-state for Tuition Purposes

Category A: An *independent* student who has established and maintained legal domicile in the State of Georgia for a period of at least 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the first day of classes for the term. *It is presumed that no student shall have gained or acquired in-state classification while attending any postsecondary educational institution in this state without clear evidence of having established domicile in Georgia for purposes other than attending a postsecondary educational institution in this state.*

Category B: A *dependent* student whose parent or U.S. court-appointed guardian has maintained legal domicile in the State of Georgia for at least 12 consecutive months immediately prior to the first day of classes for the term and who is claimed as a dependent on the parent/guardian's most recent federal income tax return.

Category C: A *dependent* student who graduated from a Georgia high school and whose parent has maintained legal domicile in the State of Georgia for at least 12 consecutive months immediately prior to the first day of classes for the term.

Section Seven – Filing Deadlines and Locations

To ensure consideration of petitions prior to initial fee payment deadlines, they must be filed no later than:

July 1 for Fall Semester **November 1** for Spring Semester **May 1** for Summer Semester

No petition will be accepted more than sixty (60) days after the term begins. Those whose petitions are received and are approved after the fee payment deadline will receive a refund of any out-of-state tuition differential paid. *Petitions will not be considered for prior semesters.*

Appendix A

Classification of Students for Tuition Purposes

from the USG Board of Regents' Policy Manual Section 403.02 (effective August 1, 2007)

A. United States Citizens

- 1) a. An independent student who has established and maintained a domicile in the State of Georgia for a period of at least 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the first day of classes for the term shall be classified as "in-state" for tuition purposes. It is presumed that no student shall have gained or acquired in-state classification while attending any postsecondary educational institution in this state without clear evidence of having established domicile in Georgia for purposes other than attending a postsecondary educational institution in this state.

b. A dependent student shall be classified as "in-state" for tuition purposes if either i) the dependent student's parent has established and maintained domicile in the State of Georgia for at least 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the first day of classes for the term and the student has graduated from a Georgia high school or ii) the dependent student's parent has established and maintained domicile in the State of Georgia for at least 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the first day of classes for the term and the parent claimed the student as a dependent on the parent's most recent federal income tax return.

c. A dependent student shall be classified as "in-state" for tuition purposes if a U.S. court-appointed legal guardian has established and maintained domicile in the State of Georgia for at least 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the first day of classes for the term provided that appointment was not made to avoid payment of out-of-state tuition and the U.S. court-appointed legal guardian can provide clear evidence of having established and maintained domicile in the State of Georgia for a period of at least 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the first day of classes for the term.
- 2) a. If an independent student classified as "in-state" relocates temporarily but returns to the State of Georgia within 12 months, the student shall be entitled to retain in-state tuition classification.

b. If the parent or U.S. court-appointed legal guardian of a dependent student currently classified as "in-state" for tuition purposes establishes domicile outside of Georgia after having established and maintained domicile in the State of Georgia, the student may retain in-state tuition classification as long as the student remains continuously enrolled in a public postsecondary educational institution in the state, regardless of the domicile of the parent or U.S. court-appointed legal guardian.

B. Noncitizens

Noncitizens initially shall not be classified as "in-state" for tuition purposes unless there is evidence to warrant consideration of in-state classification. Lawful permanent residents, refugees, asylees, or other eligible noncitizens as defined by federal Title IV regulations may be extended the same consideration as citizens of the United States in determining whether they qualify for in-state classification. International students who reside in the United States under nonimmigrant status conditioned at least in part upon intent not to abandon a foreign domicile are not eligible for in-state classification.

Appendix B

Objective Standards for Acquiring In-State Status

Ordinarily, a person from another state who comes to the University of Georgia does so for the primary or sole purpose of attending the University rather than to establish a domicile in Georgia. Thus, one who enrolls at UGA as a non-resident is presumed to remain a non-resident throughout his/her attendance unless and until he/she demonstrates by clear and convincing evidence that his/her previous domicile has been abandoned and that Georgia domicile has been established.

No person shall be eligible for classification as an in-state student at UGA unless he/she has been domiciled in and has resided in Georgia continuously for not less than 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the beginning of the term (except persons who can show that their parent or court-appointed guardian has met this requirement). However, there is a strong presumption that such persons shall continue to be classified as non-residents throughout the entire period of their enrollment. Normally, periods when enrolled in school will not count as periods of domicile for the purpose of the 12 month durational residency requirement. The following facts and circumstances, although not necessarily conclusive, have probative value to support a claim for in-state status after twelve months of continuous domicile in Georgia:

- Continuous presence in state when not enrolled as student.
- Payment of Georgia income and property taxes.
- Admission to a licensed profession in Georgia.
- Offer of permanent employment in Georgia.
- Ownership of home or real property in Georgia.
- Domicile in Georgia of relatives.

Other factors indicating intent to make Georgia one's domicile may be considered by the University. Normally, the following circumstances, in the absence of other supportive actions as described previously, do not constitute sufficient evidence of domicile to effect classification as an in-state student under the Board of Regents' policies:

- Obtaining a Georgia driver's license.
- Registering a vehicle in Georgia.
- Registering to vote in Georgia.
- Lease of living quarters in Georgia.
- Employment in a position normally filled by a student.
- Statement of intent to acquire a domicile in Georgia.
