Dear Hugh:

The Department of RL has approved a new policy concerning introductory FREN courses, as a means of increasing our French enrollments and encouraging students to take French. I am submitting it to you in the hopes that you will put it to the Senate Curriculum Committee for approval. Thanks, Noel.

Policy:

Incoming freshmen who have had two or more years of high school French are still required to take the UGA placement exam, administered by Clarke-Howell Hall. Those students whose scores place them into FREN1110 will now have the option to take FREN1001 (for which they will receive credit) or FREN1110. Upon successful completion of FREN1110, students will be eligible to take FREN2001, which is frequently the last course that is required. Those students who opt to take FREN1001, however, will still have to take FREN1002 before taking the 2001 course. Students who place in FREN1002 or above will not have the option to enroll in the first semester course for credit.
