The subcommittee approved the following non-credit activities from the Office of Instruction to be included as options on the Experiential Learning Transcript:

EL Internship Program (Category: Internship) Office of Online Learning Administrative Intern (Category: Internship) Office of Online Learning Marketing Intern (Category: Internship) Office of Online Learning Video Technology Intern (Category: Internship) Office of Online Learning Web Developer Intern (Category: Internship)

The subcommittee also approved the request from the Office of Instruction, Office of Student Financial Aid Internships (Category: Internship), to be included as an option on the Experiential Learning Transcript with a recommendation that language be added in the challenge section that articulates the opportunities students will have for professional training and the enhanced responsibility of handling confidential information.

The Director of Experiential Learning, Andrew Potter, discussed some updates regarding Experiential Learning.

The subcommittee discussed the process for Experiential Learning student appeals and the language that would be added to the policy regarding the process for students to appeal to allow experiences that are not currently approved to satisfy the Experiential Learning requirement. The subcommittee voted to approve the addition of the student appeals process language to the Experiential Learning Policy with an amendment. In additional the process for appeals, the subcommittee requested that any appeals approved by a school's/college's Experiential Learning Certification Officer be forwarded to the Office of

Experiential Learning for notification. The Experiential Learning Office will compile a yearly report of all approved appeals and provide this report to the Experiential Learning Subcommittee for review.
